Consider the following:

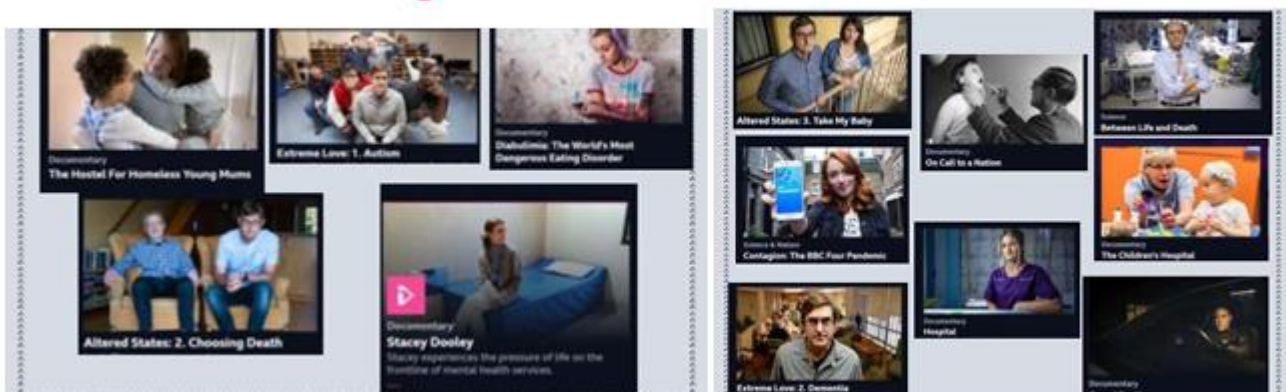
- *What issues, if any, are being raised in the stimulus?*
